to children and autistic children.

- 2 Send the proposal to your supervisor.
- 3 As soon as your supervisor agrees, contact the General Delegate (Coline Chaumont) and complete your application (the application template is available on [inwego](#) under the "INDIGO Foundation" tab).
- 4 The INDIGO Foundation approves the project and the donation amount at the Executive Committee meeting and gets back to you to monitor the project.
